NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are true and correct and hereby ratified and confirmed by the City Commission.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Commission of the City of Pembroke Pines, Florida, hereby express their support of the Department of Community Affairs "Breaking The Cycle" Program and express willingness to enter into an interlocal or joint powers agreement with Broward County, the terms and conditions of which will be negotiated in good faith, so as to mutually undertake efforts to create and implement Local Mitigation Strategies.

Section 3. The site located at the Southwest corner of 196 Avenue and Sheridan Street is designated as a natural reservation on the City of Pembroke Pines Urban Greenways and Natural Reserve Map adopted in its Recreation and Open Space Element of the City's Comprehensive Plan and is a priority for implementing the City's local mitigation strategies. The City shall continue to proceed to change the Future Land Use designation of the site from Estate to Conservation.
