RESOLUTION NO. 3027

1 **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY**
2 **OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING AND**
3 **ADOPTING THE BROWARD COUNTY MULTI-**
4 **JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN EFFECTIVE**
5 **FROM DECEMBER 30, 2004 TO DECEMBER 29, 2009;**
6 **PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR**
7 **SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE**
8 **DATE.**

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11 **WHEREAS,** Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, requires municipalities and counties
12 to plan for hazard mitigation, hurricane evacuation, post-disaster redevelopment planning,
13 and a local mitigation strategy; and

14 **WHEREAS,** the State of Florida, Department of Community Affairs (DCA) has
15 designated Broward County Emergency Management Division as the local coordinator of
16 the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan for the municipalities located within Broward County;
17 and

18 **WHEREAS,** pursuant to City of Pembroke Pines Resolution No. 2776, adopted
19 September 20, 2000, the City adopted the Broward County Local Mitigation Strategy; and

21 **WHEREAS,** the Broward County Board of County Commissioners has revised
22 its original Local Mitigation Strategy to comply with the new mitigation planning criteria
23 issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and has subsequently
24 adopted this Broward County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan ("Plan") for a
25 five-year period, having an effective date of December 30, 2004 and ending December
26 29, 2009; and

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1 **WHEREAS**, FEMA has found that this revised Plan is in compliance with the
2 Federal hazard mitigation planning standards imposed as a result of the Disaster
3 Mitigation Act of 2000, as set forth in 444 CFR 201.6; and

4 **WHEREAS**, those Broward County municipalities adopting the Plan become
5 eligible applicants, through the State of Florida, for mitigation grant programs
6 administered by FEMA, including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, the Pre-Disaster
7 Mitigation Competitive Program for mitigation projects and planning grants, and the
8 Flood Mitigation Assistance Program limited to Repetitive Loss properties insured
9 through the National Flood Insurance Program; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the City Commission of the City of Pembroke Pines finds that the
11 adoption of the Broward Plan is in the best interests of the health, safety, and general
12 welfare of the City, its residents, citizens, and visitors.

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14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION**
15 **OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, THAT:**

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17 **Section 1.** The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are true and correct and
18 hereby ratified and confirmed by the City Commission.

19 **Section 2.** The Broward County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan,
20 effective December 30, 2004 through December 29, 2009, is supported and adopted by

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1 the City of Pembroke Pines .

2 **Section 3.** The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a certified copy of this
3 Resolution the Broward County Emergency Management Agency.

4 **Section 4.** All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are
5 hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

6 **Section 5.** If any clause, section, other part or application of this Resolution is
7 held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or
8 application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this
9 Resolution.

10 **Section 6.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its
11 passage and adoption.

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
