

PROPOSED RESOLUTION NO. 2010-R-02

RESOLUTION NO. 3254

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING AND ADOPTING THE BROWARD COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN PURSUANT TO THE DISASTER MITIGATION ACT OF 2000; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, requires municipalities and counties to plan for hazard mitigation, hurricane evacuation, post-disaster redevelopment planning, and a local mitigation strategy; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida, Department of Community Affairs ("DCA") has designated Broward County Emergency Management Division as the local coordinator of the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan for the municipalities located within Broward County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Pembroke Pines Resolution No. 2776, adopted September 20, 2000, the City adopted the Broward County Local Mitigation Strategy; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2005, the City of Pembroke Pines City Commission adopted Resolution No. 3027, thereby adopting Broward County's hazard mitigation plan for the time period from December 30, 2004 through December 29, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners has

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revised its original Local Mitigation Strategy to comply with the new mitigation planning criteria issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA"), and has subsequently adopted this Broward County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan ("Plan"); and

WHEREAS, FEMA has found that this revised Plan is in compliance with the Federal hazard mitigation planning standards imposed as a result of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, as set forth in 444 CFR 201.6; and

WHEREAS, those Broward County municipalities adopting the Plan become eligible applicants, through the State of Florida, for mitigation grant programs administered by FEMA, including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Competitive Program for mitigation projects and planning grants, and the Flood Mitigation Assistance Program limited to Repetitive Loss properties insured through the National Flood Insurance Program; and

WHEREAS, adoption of the Plan further ensures that the City will remain eligible for hazard mitigation grant funding once a disaster has been declared by the President; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pembroke Pines finds that the adoption of the Broward Plan is in the best interests of the health, safety, and

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general welfare of the City, its residents, citizens, and visitors.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, THAT:**

Section 1. The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are true and correct and hereby ratified and confirmed by the City Commission.

Section 2. The Broward County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, is hereby supported and adopted by the City Commission of the City of Pembroke Pines.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution the Broward County Emergency Management Agency.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. If any clause, section, other part or application of this Resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this Resolution.

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Section 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
