If the **LBCV** cannot beat the lowest bid by at least 1%, an opportunity will be given to the **VOSB**. If the **VOSB** cannot beat the lowest bid by at least 1%, then the bid will be awarded to the lowest bidder.

If multiple VOSBs submit bids/quotes which are within 2.5% of the lowest bid/quote and there are no LPPV or LBCV as described in Section 35.36 of the City's Code of Ordinance, entitled "Local Vendor Preference", then all VOSBs will be asked to submit a Best and Final Offer (BAFO). The award will be made to the VOSB submitting the lowest BAFO providing that that BAFO is at least 1% lower than the lowest bid/quote received in the original solicitation. If no VOSB can beat the lowest bid/quote by at least 1%, then the award will be made to the lowest responsive bidder.


