CITY MANAGER'S REPORT:

Jonathan Bonilla welcomed the parents to the new school year. He spoke about

the charter schools being designated as A+ for the 2024-2025 school year and the

system is listed in the top 10% of the nation in US News and World Report publication.

Nalini Sohit-Vazquez, spoke about the fundraising efforts for the charter schools

by listing the various areas of participation, which include the parent donation, corporate

banners and sponsorships, parent banners, email blasts from partnerships, restaurant

events, and SOS dress down days. She stated there had been great participation

already since the beginning of school and encouraged parents to pick up flyers at the

table that give information for fundraising events.

MINUTES:

A motion by Vice Chair Dawkins, seconded by Member Hteit, to approve the June 9, 2025 minutes as received passed unanimously.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

Principal Bayer welcomed the parents to the new school year. He spoke about testing that had taken place for ninth graders and tenth graders on Wednesday. He reported that the school has been recognized as an A+ school for 2024-2025. He reported there are ten sports teams already active or will be active within the month. He spoke about the current uniform situation and asked parents help in keeping with dress code. Some girls are rolling up their shorts after leaving their parents' purview. The Parent Student Handbook for Academic Village was discussed and approved by the board to be sent to the City Commission for final approval. The use of AI in the classrooms and plagiarism was discussed. The allowance of wearing spirit shirts on Fridays was addressed.

A motion by Member Gill, seconded by Member White to approve the Parent Student Handbook for Academic Village for 2025-2026 passed unanimously.

OPEN FORUM:

Board Member Htiet thanked the administration for the new nets and poles for the water polo team. All use in the classroom and students using the technology correctly was spoken about. The changing of the school start time that was to begin in 2026 was questioned. Mr. Bayer stated that a school district can opt out of the requirement with the state and the charter schools would follow the daily start schedule

that Broward District Schools implements. An emergency drill was discussed, parents

asking why students were sent into an area where a disturbance was reported. Mr.

Bayer stated it turned into a false alarm and the students are taught to flee if they can.

The situation is being evaluated. Lunch prices were also discussed.
