HISTORY

- In 1943, the U.S. Navy constructed North Perry Airport (HWO) for use as a satellite training field in connection with flight training activities at Miami Naval Air Station
- The U.S. Navy operated the training field before and after World War II. Broward County leased the facility before acquiring it on October 11, 1957
- HWO is a public-use general aviation airport that serves aircraft and business owners that support light aircraft
- The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Air Traffic Control Tower at HWO is the busiest federal contract facility in the U.S.
