PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2023-17

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 33 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES BY AMENDING §33.64, ENTITLED "INVESTMENT OF GENERAL EMPLOYEES' PENSION FUNDS;" ADOPTING A REVISED INVESTMENT POLICY INCORPORATED INTO SECTION 33.64 TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF 112.662, FLORIDA STATUTES, AS AMENDED BY CH. 2023-28, LAWS OF FLORIDA, TO CLARIFY THAT INVESTMENT DECISIONS SHALL BE BASED SOLELY ON PECUNIARY FACTORS AS FURTHER DETAILED IN EXHIBIT "A," ATTACHED HERETO AND INCORPROATED HEREIN BY REFERENCE; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The provisions contained in this Section A. constitute exemptions as provided in Section 166.041(4)(c). If one or more boxes are checked in Section A below, a business impact estimate is not required by state law for the proposed ordinance.

Section A.

The proposed ordinance is required for compliance with Federal or State law or regulation;
The proposed ordinance relates to the issuance or refinancing of debt;
The proposed ordinance relates to the adoption of budgets or budget amendments, including revenue sources necessary to fund the budget;

c. Section 553.73, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Building Code; ord. Section 633.202, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Fire Prevention Code.
