Professional Bio

For 40 years, I have been working in various aspects of real estate including residential sales, commercial leasing, commercial development, commercial property management, commercial lease enforcement, accounting, construction, and computer systems integration.

Like many people living in South Florida, I am a native of the American Northeast. Born in Washington, DC to parents working for the federal government, I grew up mostly in Pennsylvania and moved to Manhattan at age 20 to work full-time and continue taking classes at several New York schools including NYU and Pace University. Focusing on property management, accounting, and computer systems, I was able to begin my career, thriving there professionally in the field of commercial real estate.

I first started as a property accountant with the commercial real estate firm Cushman and Wakefield. Proving myself to be an excellent multi-tasker with a penchant for numbers, I quickly expanded to property management and commercial lease enforcement. From there, my work moved to other New York companies, focusing on additional areas of real estate including REITs, commercial development, and construction. I was also the controller of a real estate law firm focusing on environmental real estate law for major New York commercial developers.

Amidst that mix of business, I was able to indulge my more creative side, and I opened my own art gallery on Madison Avenue.
