5 UNDERSTANDING AND APPROACH TO THE WORK

5.1 Statement of Understanding

Vera understands this bid is primarily intended to address vehicles listed on Attachment M and the pricing proposed is only offered for automobiles, light trucks, heavy trucks, and specialty trucks for all of the City Departments except for the Fire Department vehicles.

Vera has also reviewed vehicles listed on Attachment N, although these vehicles are not included in this bid Vera will work to be a "one stop" solution for the City and all of its fleet needs. Vera is able to expand services and personnel as necessary if awarded the contract. Vera has the facility and capability to provide automotive services beyond repairs and maintenance. Vera can perform custom accessory installations and vehicle modifications such as strobe lighting installations, fuel monitoring system installations and security system installations as some examples. Vera will work closely with the City to provide a consolidated solution for all of its fleet needs and seek solutions in the City's best interest.

Vera also understands the primary objectives for this solicitation/requirement are as follows:

- Reduce overall fleet maintenance cost
- Improve fleet availability
- Improve services offered to the City departments using vehicles

Vera will achieve these goals by:

- Providing services on an as-needed basis instead of a fixed monthly expense

Vera will house up to 10 spare vehicles on premises to facilitate easy exchange when necessary. Vera will also implement weekly maintenance inspections to keep batteries charged and tires inflated. The vehicles will be washed and ready for use when necessary.

A log book will be used to track spare vehicles being checked in and out. Vera can provide physical inspections and mileage readings, if requested.

Vera has recently purchased a state-of-the-art automated roll-over car wash with reverse osmosis water purification, liquid wax, chemical drying agent and blow dryer to provide a spot free rinse. Vehicles can be washed in less than 2 minutes. This proposal will include free car washes for City vehicles at any time we are open will not require any services or repairs to be performed in conjunction with the car wash. 5.3 Maintenance & Repair Service

Vera will service and repair all makes and model vehicles to become a single source solution for the City. If in the event a repair cannot be performed by the Vera team on any vehicle, Vera will resolve the repair by subcontracting the local dealer for that vehicle make. The City will not need to have vehicles taken anywhere other than to Vera for repair.

Vera has a full service collision center and can perform body and paint repairs on all makes and models. Vera is a direct repair provider for many of the large insurance companies. We have the ability and experience to handle all claim services in the event of an insurance claim. Vera can also provide free estimates for body repairs upon request.

5.4 Manufacturer Warranties and Recalls

Vera will provide warranty and recall service for all of the different vehicles makes and models that the City utilizes, at no charge to the City. We will also transport vehicles other than General Motors to the local dealers to have warranty and recall services performed at no charge to the City.

Vera will contact the above vendors, schedule service, and transport City vehicles to and from for warranty and recall repairs. We will also verify warranty and recall service by utilizing Carfax for all vehicles immediately when the cars arrive for service or repair. This process ensures vehicles are routed properly and the City's fleet is maintained in top shape.

5.5 Contractor Warranty on Work and Labor

Quality control inspections will be performed by lead technicians after each repair service is completed. This process ensures quality of work and reduces or eliminates the likelihood of vehicles coming back for related issues.

Vera will perform a vehicle history check when vehicles arrive and verify that the vehicle has not been in the repair shop for same or similar repair within the last 90 days. If it has, the vehicle will be treated as a "comeback". This means the Shop Foreman will perform diagnosis to determine if the issue is the same or a coincidental failure. All "comeback" repairs will be tracked on an electronic log. This log will serve as a management tool for performance tracking and ensuring similar problems do not reoccur.

5.6 Road Side/Off Site Services

Vera will offer 24hr Emergency Roadside Assistance for flat tires, battery service, vehicle-lock out and no fuel situations. When Roadside Assistance is needed, a call will need to be placed directly to the roadside technician's cell phone. The average response time for the City of Pembroke Pines is 30 minutes.

5.7 Driver and Vehicle Transportation Service

Vera will provide free shuttle transportation to and from the City facilities when vehicles are dropped off or picked up. We will have two methods: (a) Vera Courtesy Shuttle and (b) our Corporate Uber Account. Regardless of the mode utilized, the average wait time to be picked up will be under 15 minutes. With use of Uber there are an unlimited number of drivers and no schedule restrictions. These options allow the City employees flexibility to suite their work schedules.

Vera will also offer a free service to pick up vehicles from the City facilities and return the vehicles to the City facilities once service is performed upon request.



5.8 Scheduling and Prioritization System

Scheduling with Vera is absolutely convenient and available by accessing our web-based scheduling portal through any computer with an internet connection.

The City employees can access a URL link which Vera will provide to authorized users. The employee can enter their user name and password and have immediate access to live scheduling software. The City will also have ability to bring vehicles in without appointment when the nature of the vehicle issue does not allow scheduling in advance. For example, if the vehicle is suddenly inoperable and must be towed. In this case an appointment is not necessary. These vehicles will be dispatched on a first come, first serve basis. Appointments for regular, non-emergency maintenance ensures quicker turnaround times and improves fleet availability.

Since the City will be utilizing the same schedule as our other customers use, the City will have equal priority and access to available resources. Priority for City owned vehicle will not be any less than privately owned vehicles. Furthermore, Vera currently operates 2 shifts and additional resources will be added as needed.

Vera will send automatic email notifications and text messages for oil change reminders to the email address & cell numbers the City provides.

5.9 Maintenance Records

Vera provides the City with one of the most convenient and transparent ways to audit or view a vehicle's maintenance records from the day the car comes into our shop. We will provide the City with a convenient login to our web-based maintenance portal which allows the City staff to schedule service appointments, view maintenance records, repair costs, etc. This is one way for Vera to maintain accountability and ensure our customers are fully informed.


Vera's car maintenance portal begins record maintenance from the date when the vehicle first comes to our facilities. If the City has previous maintenance records, electronically or on paper, we have the ability to import those records into our portal.

Having all historical records including maintenance and service history logs in one place will allow the City to keep its fleet information organized.

5.10 Calculation of Labor Hours and Turnaround Time

Vera will use ALLDATA for estimating repairs and pre-determined labor hours for repairs. ALLDATA is an online source for automotive OEM information. ALLDATA provides vehicle manufacturers' diagnostic and repair information as well as labor time estimates. This online application will be utilized for consistent estimating practices.

Vera will commence work within 4 hours of a scheduled vehicle arriving in our facility. Times will vary for vehicles without an appointment. However, our average turnaround time on repairs is 24 hours.

Turnaround time will be determined by nature of work being performed and parts availability. One of the primary goals for this RFP is to improve fleet availability and every effort will be made to expedite replacement parts and installation to accomplish this goal by having the most frequently needed parts in stock. Note. If you are a U.S. person and a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- · An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien;
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States;
- . An estate (other than a foreign estate); or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax under section 1446 on any foreign partners' share of effectively connected taxable income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, the rules under section 1446 require a partnership to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the section 1446 withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of partnership income.

In the cases below, the following person must give Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States:

- In the case of a disregarded entity with a U.S. owner, the U.S. owner of the disregarded entity and not the entity;
- In the case of a grantor trust with a U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner, generally, the U.S. grantor or other U.S. owner of the grantor trust and not the trust; and
- In the case of a U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust), the U.S. trust (other than a grantor trust) and not the beneficiaries of the trust.

Foreign person. If you are a foreign person or the U.S. branch of a foreign bank that has elected to be treated as a U.S. person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 or Form 8233 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien. Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the payee has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

- The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
- 2. The treaty article addressing the income.
- The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
- 4. The type and amount of income that qualifies for the exemption from tax.
- Sufficient facts to justify the exemption from tax under the terms of the treaty article.

Example. Article 20 of the U.S.-China income tax treaty allows an exemption from tax for scholarship income received by a Chinese student temporarily present in the United States. Under U.S. Iaw, this student will become a resident alien for tax purposes if his or her stay in the United States exceeds 5 calendar years. However, paragraph 2 of the first Protocol to the U.S.-China treaty (dated April 30, 1984) allows the provisions of Article 20 to continue to apply even after the Chinese student becomes a resident alien of the United States. A Chinese student who qualifies for this exception (under paragraph 2 of the first protocol) and is relying on this exception to claim an exemption from tax on his or her scholarship or fellowship income would attach to Form W-9 a statement that includes the information described above to support that exemption.

If you are a nonresident alien or a foreign entity, give the requester the appropriate completed Form W-8 or Form 8233.

Backup Withholding

What is backup withholding? Persons making certain payments to you must under certain conditions withhold and pay to the IRS 28% of such payments. This is called "backup withholding." Payments that may be subject to backup withholding include interest, tax-exempt interest, dividends, broker and barter exchange transactions, rents, royalties, nonemployee pay, payments made in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, and certain payments from fishing boat operators. Real estate transactions are not subject to backup withholding.

You will not be subject to backup withholding on payments you receive if you give the requester your correct TIN, make the proper certifications, and report all your taxable interest and dividends on your tax return.

Payments you receive will be subject to backup withholding if:

- 1. You do not furnish your TIN to the requester,
- You do not certify your TIN when required (see the Part II instructions on page 3 for details),

- 3. The IRS tells the requester that you furnished an incorrect TIN,
- The IRS tells you that you are subject to backup withholding because you did not report all your interest and dividends on your tax return (for reportable interest and dividends only), or
- You do not certify to the requester that you are not subject to backup withholding under 4 above (for reportable interest and dividend accounts opened after 1983 only).

Certain payees and payments are exempt from backup withholding. See Exempt payee code on page 3 and the separate Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Also see Special rules for partnerships above.

What is FATCA reporting?

The Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA) requires a participating foreign financial institution to report all United States account holders that are specified United States persons. Certain payees are exempt from FATCA reporting. See Exemption from FATCA reporting code on page 3 and the Instructions for the Requester of Form W-9 for more information.

Updating Your Information

You must provide updated information to any person to whom you claimed to be an exempt payee if you are no longer an exempt payee and anticipate receiving reportable payments in the future from this person. For example, you may need to provide updated information if you are a C corporation that elects to be an S corporation, or if you no longer are tax exempt. In addition, you must furnish a new Form W-9 if the name or TIN changes for the account; for example, if the grantor of a grantor trust dies.

Penalties

Failure to furnish TIN. If you fail to furnish your correct TIN to a requester, you are subject to a penalty of \$50 for each such failure unless your failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.

Civil penalty for false information with respect to withholding. If you make a false statement with no reasonable basis that results in no backup withholding, you are subject to a \$500 penalty.

Criminal penalty for falsifying information. Willfully falsifying certifications or affirmations may subject you to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment

Misuse of TINs. If the requester discloses or uses TINs in violation of federal law, the requester may be subject to civil and criminal penalties.

In addition, the business must have a current business tax receipt from the Broward County or the city within Broward County where the business resides.

A preference of five percent (5%) of the total evaluation point, or five percent (5%) of the total price, shall be given to the **Local Pembroke Pines Vendor(s)**; A preference of two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total evaluation point for local, or two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total price, shall be given to the **Local Broward County Vendor(s)**.

COMPARISON OF QUALIFICATIONS

The preferences established in no way prohibit the right of the City to compare quality of supplies or services for purchase and to compare qualifications, character, responsibility and fitness of all persons, firms or corporations submitting bids or proposals. Further, the preference established in no way prohibit the right of the city from giving any other preference permitted by law instead of the preferences granted, nor prohibit the city to select the bid or proposal which is the most responsible and in the best interests of the city.



SECTION 1 GENERAL TERM

VETERAN OWNED SMALL BUSINESS (VOSB) PREFEREENCE

The evaluation of competitive bids is subject to section 35.37 of the City's Procurement Procedures which, except where contrary to federal and state law, or any other funding source requirements, provides that preference be given to veteran owned small businesses. To satisfy this requirement, the vendor shall affirm in writing its compliance with the following objective criteria as of the bid or proposal submission date stated in the solicitation. A veteran owned small business shall be defined as:

 "Veteran Owned Small Business" shall mean a business entity which has received a "Determination Letter" from the United States Department of Veteran Affairs Center for Verification and Evaluation notifying the business that they have been approved as a Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB).

A preference of two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total evaluation point, or two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total price, shall be given to the **Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB)**. This shall mean that if a **VOSB** submits a bid/quote that is within 2.5% of the lowest price submitted by any vendor, the **VOSB** shall have an option to submit another bid which is at least 1% lower than the lowest responsive bid/quote. If the **VOSB** submits a bid which is at least 1% lower than that lowest responsive bid/quote, then the award will go to the **VOSB**. If not, the award will be made to the vendor that submits the lowest responsive bid/quote. If the lowest responsive and responsible bidder IS a "**Local Pembroke Pines Vendor" (LPPV)** or a "**Local Broward County Vendor" (LBCV)** as established in Section 35.36 of the City's Code of Ordinances, entitled "Local Vendor Preference", then the award will be made to that vendor and no other bidders will be given an opportunity to submit additional bids as described herein.

If there is a LPPV, a LBCV, and a VOSB participating in the same bid solicitation and all three vendors qualify to submit a second bid, the LPPV will be given first option. If the LPPV cannot beat the lowest bid received by at least 1%, an opportunity will be given to the LBCV. If the LBCV cannot beat the lowest bid by at least 1%, an opportunity will be given to the VOSB. If the VOSB cannot beat the lowest bid by at least 1%, then the bid will be awarded to the lowest bidder.
