PRE-ADOPTION PUBLIC HEARING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)

August 5, 2018

The City of Pembroke Pines is an entitlement recipient of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and anticipates receiving an estimated \$822,253 in Program Year 2018-2019 to address community development and housing needs in Pembroke Pines. In order to receive these funds, the City must adopt a One-Year Action Plan that is consistent with its 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development Programs.

2018 Annual Action Plan Summary

For Program Year 2018-2019, the City is proposing to undertake the following projects with the anticipated \$822,253 it is scheduled to receive from HUD. This funding is anticipated being available October 1, 2018.

Residential Rehabilitation (Minor Home Repair)

\$234,464

This project will provide home repair assistance to low and moderate income homeowners who are experiencing conditions in and around the home that pose a threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the household occupants. This project will be carried out on a citywide basis. This activity is eligible under 24 CFR section 570.202(a), and will benefit low and moderate income persons as qualified under 570.208 (a)(3).

Public Service (Senior Transportation)

\$123,338

Provides support to the City's Senior Transportation Program through the provision of free transportation to seniors. Riders are transported to and from doctor/dentist office, governmental agencies, therapeutic field trips, and shopping. The activity is eligible as a public service under 570.201(e), and the activity will benefit low and moderate-income persons as qualified under Limited Clientele Activities, 570.208(a)(2).

Public Facilities & Improvements (South West Focal Point Community Center)

\$300,000

This project proposes to construct a parking garage at the South West Focal Point Community Center. The project qualifies as a public improvement. Public facilities and improvements include acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or installation of public facilities and improvements and are eligible under 570.201(c). This activity will benefit low and moderate income persons as qualified under 570.208(a)(1) Area Benefit Activities.

Program Administration

\$164,451

This activity will provide general management, oversight, and coordination of the programs. Also, this activity will provide fair housing services designed to further the fair housing objectives of the Fair Housing Act (42 U.C.C. 3601-20). These activities are assumed to benefit low-and moderate-income persons and are eligible under 24 CFR section 570.206(a).

Public Comment

Citizens are encouraged to review the 2018-2019 Program Year Draft Action Plan and provide written comment. Copies of the documents are available for review and comment during the 30-day period commencing August 6, 2018 and ending September 4, 2018 at the Office of the City Clerk located at the Pembroke Pines City Hall, 601 City Center Way, Pembroke Pines, Florida between 7:00 AM and 6:00 PM., Monday-Thursday. Prior to adoption, the City of Pembroke Pines Commission will hold a public hearing on the proposed Program Year 2018-2019 Action Plan on Tuesday, September 4th, 2018 at 6:30 PM in the Commission Chamber at City Hall, located at, 601 City Center Way, Pembroke Pines, Florida.
