Thanks for running this by. I think the language is fine.

Regarding the State's site identification number (just in case):

The "8" refers to: "Florida."
The "BD" refers to: "Broward."

The "92" refers to: the site's specific identification number.

Although 8BD92 is the correct (complete) form, it's not unusual for the "8" to be dropped when referencing the site. Within Florida, referring to a site by just the County abbreviation and site number is fine.

The "8" would be included in out-of-state correspondence though (for example – when corresponding with a Federal agency).

The City hereby designates the Buzzards Roost Archeological site a historic resource which has a Florida Master Site File Number 8BD92, consistent with the Broward County designation pursuant to Resolution No. 2017-558, adopted December 5, 2017.
