## Timeline of Events


- First Meeting: The Elementary A+ Committee from all three campuses met on Tuesday, October 8, 2019 at 9:30 A.M. at Central Campus. We discussed the questionnaire based on the prior year's questionnaire.
- Questionnaire Vote: The questionnaire was open for voting on Monday, October 14, 2019 and Tuesday, October 15, 2019 from 8:00 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. Staff and teachers were required to initial after voting. All questionnaires were placed in a locked box.
- **Second Meeting:** The Elementary A+ Committee from all three campuses met on Monday, October 21, 2019 at 9:30 A.M. at Central Campus to count the questionnaires and edit the ballot. An email was sent to all staff and teachers with the results of the questionnaire.
- Ballot Vote: The ballot was open for voting on Monday, October 28, 2019 and Tuesday, October 29, 2019. Staff and teachers were required to initial after voting. All ballots were placed in a locked box.
- Third Meeting: The Elementary A+ Committee from all three campuses met on Friday, November 1, 2019 at Central Campus to count the ballots. An email was sent to all staff and teachers with the results of the ballot.

# Results of the Questionnaire

- 1. The majority voted that the amount received by all staff should be based on time served (full-time & part-time).
- 2. The majority voted that teachers who only worked a portion of the year will be entitled to receive a prorated amount of the entire amount of the A+ funds.
- 3. The majority voted that interim subs will be entitled to receive a prorated amount of the entire amount of the A+ funds.
- 4. The majority voted that non-instructional staff members, including Calvin Giordano/FCS and the SRO will be entitled to receive a portion of the A+ bonus.
- 5. The majority voted that a portion of the A+ bonus should not be given to the departments, the school's operating fund, or SOS.



## Results of the Ballot

The majority voted for Option 1:

• 100% Full-Time Instructional

& Full-Time Non-Instructional

• 50% Part-Time Non-Instructional

## Distribution of A+ Funds

- The official Elementary school grade rating received was an "A."
