Please accept the following memorandum as a formal request to standardize and purchase the Wanco/Vetted Security Solutions Portable Video Surveillance (PVS) Trailer (Model #VS-WCTS-PVS), these technology trailers in their configuration allow law enforcement personnel to safely and effectively capture, prevent, and deter crime. The PVS Trailer consists of a diesel engine mounted on a towable, deployable chassis which incorporates an electric winch tower that houses multiple pan, tilt, zoom (PTZ) surveillance cameras. The units also utilize solar panels connected to rechargeable internally batteries that allow the trailer to operate for extended periods of time (up to four weeks). The winch tower can be elevated up to 29 feet, and the PTZ cameras are operated remotely by trained law enforcement personnel.

Advantages of standardizing the PVS trailer are as follows:

- 1. Ease of training for new operators and maintaining familiarity with the equipment in its configuration. The police department purchased one (1) PVS Trailer in May 2018, the unit has been utilized by operators in the burglary suppression team who are trained for its use and deployment. Standardizing this equipment will allow for more responsive and timely deployment of additional units as they are purchased—due to personnel already being trained and familiar in its use.
- 2. Ease in cross-communication with existing police department license plate reader (LPR) technology. The burglary suppression team currently makes use of (9) LPR systems that are deployed throughout the city and have been in use for the last four years. These LPR systems communicate to one another via a proprietary network that will be compatible with the PVS Trailer's standardized software & hardware configuration. As a result, future & additional PVS Trailer purchases will allow them to be seamlessly integrated with the existing PVS Trailer equipment as well as with existing LPR systems currently utilized by the police department,

(3) City standard, single-source and sole-source commodities or services. City standard, single-source and sole-source commodities or services are exempt from this section.

I respectfully request that the City of Pembroke Pines recognize the Wanco/Vetted Security Solutions PVS Trailer (Model #VS-WCTS-PVS) as a city standard source.
