RE: City of Pembroke Pines / Proposed Resolution for
Referendum on
Terminating Red Light Camera Enforcement Program

At its May 6, 2020, meeting, the City Commission directed this office to prepare a resolution to place a referendum question on the August 18, 2020, special election ballot concerning the continuation of the City's red light camera enforcement program. The proposed resolution schedules the referendum for the August 18, 2020 municipal special election, which coincides with the statewide primary election, and sets forth the following ballot question:

**WHETHER THE CITY SHOULD TERMINATE ITS RED LIGHT
CAMERA ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM**

**SHALL THE CITY OF PEMBROKE PINES TERMINATE ITS RED
LIGHT CAMERA ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM?**

Also on the May 20, 2020, agenda is consideration of the proposed 2-year renewal of the City's agreement with its red light camera vendor, Redflex. This matter was deferred from the May 6, 2020, City Commission meeting. The approval by the City Commission of any renewal of the agreement would extend the program. Therefore, the resolution provides that should the referendum pass, the termination of the program would be affective at the end

of the contract term with the City's red light camera program vendor to avoid the possibility of impairment of contracts. Should the City Commission not approve a renewal of the agreement with Redflex, then the agreement would expire in July, 2020, and the red light camera enforcement program would cease operating at that time. The City Commission would then need to determine whether it would still desire to proceed with a referendum on the issue.
