A) Completing the Proposal Form

- 1) Please enter your firm's name in the yellow cell located in the top right corner of this page.
- 2) Similarly, the following tabs of this excel file will have yellow cells in which the proposer would need to complete. The other cells on the page will be locked and will automatically calculate other line items such as the Franchise Fee.
- 3) The last tabs of the file starting with the word "Summary" are just summary tabs with estimated customers, containers and quantities that are provided as a reference for evaluations and may vary and actual quantities may fluctuate throughout the term of the contract.

B) Turnkey Vs. Collection Only (Disposal Pass Through)

- 1) **Generation Factor:** The City's Proposal Form includes a section for the Proposer to enter in the estimated Solid Waste or Recycling Generation Factor which will be used to automatically calculate the Disposal Fee for the various categories based on the Disposal Fee of the City's current Disposal Site.
- 2) **Collection Fee:** In addition, the form includes a section for the proposers to submit their Collection Fee, for the different services and categories, among other line items.
- 3) **Turnkey Solution:** In the event that the City awards the contract as a "Turnkey" contract, the City will utilize the Waste Generation Factor that the Contractor used in their bid proposal and the Contractor will be responsible for paying the Tipping Fees at the disposal site.

In the event that there is a change to the tipping fee at the Disposal Facility, a dollar for dollar adjustment shall be made accordingly to the Disposal portion of the rates, by re-calculating the Disposal Fees based on the Waste Generation Factor submitted in the Proposer's submittal.

- 4) **Collection Only (Disposal Pass Through) Solution:** In the event that the City awards the contract as a "Collection Only (Disposal Pass Through)" contract, the Contractor will still be responsible for taking the waste to the designated disposal facility, however the City will either pay the disposal fees directly to Disposal Facility and the awarded hauler will not be responsible for the disposal fee and will not receive any compensation for the disposal fees or the City will reimburse the Contractor for actual disposal costs incurred at the Disposal of waste related to this contract.

C) Split Awards

- Residential Recycling

- Commercial (Includes Apartment Complexes)
- Multi-family Service Unit (Condominium Residential Units)

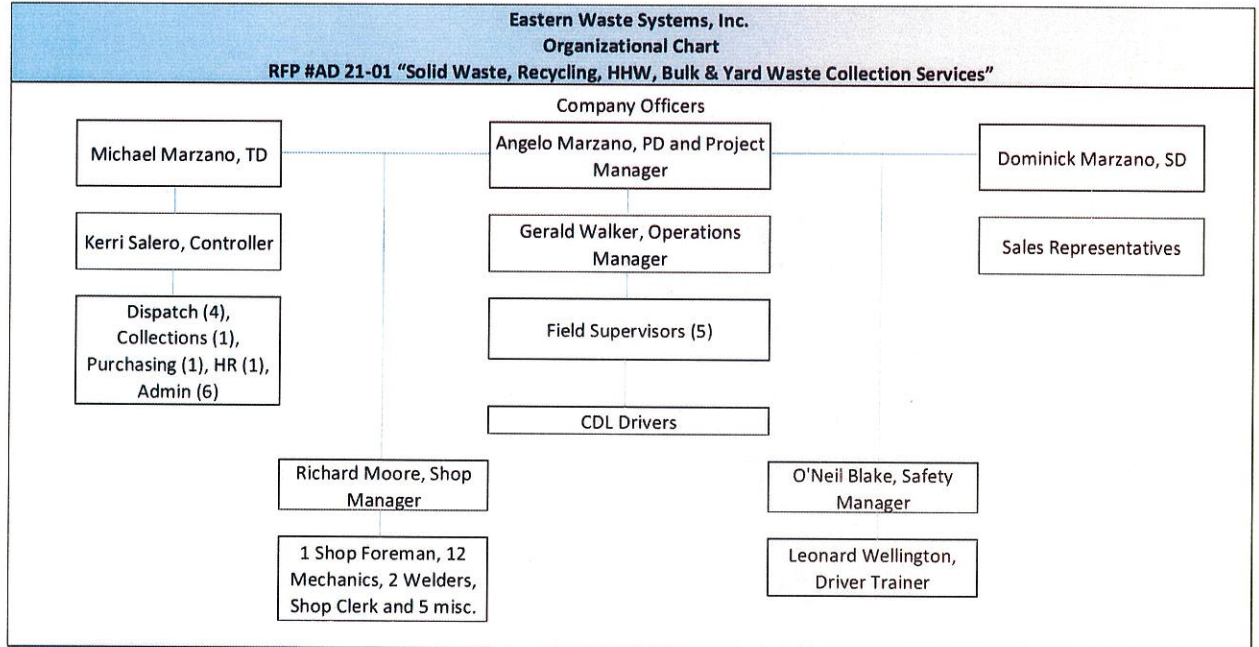

EWS is proposing to continue to provide the services under the current collection schedules to ensure a seamless transition in services.

4. **Operating in Conjunction with the Disposal Facility:** EWS will utilize the disposal facility as designated by the City of Pembroke Pines. EWS will either establish or maintain an account with the designated disposal facility with the appropriate credit limits to manage the disposal if the City elects a "turnkey" option for disposal. EWS will work with the City and designated disposal facility to ensure all deliverable waste is disposed in compliance and reported with accuracy.
5. **Transition Plan:** EWS is proposing to resume its current operations at the current service levels provided from the existing Contractor without any interruption any of service. 2. **GPS, PTO and Camera Monitoring Technology:** All EWS collection, supervisory and maintenance units are equipped with AWTI Third-Eye technology. Third Eye Refuse Collection Systems wrap all units in 360° of camera coverage to monitor vehicle and driver environment in real time.



Third-Eye technology allows EWS the ability to track and record the hours collection vehicles are working and their exact location. In addition, 24-hour access to all on board camera systems allow for EWS to review service performance and research any complaints or issues swiftly and effectively in real time, thus enhancing customer service for the City and its residents.

3. **Weight Monitoring Technology:** EWS business systems provide for daily input of all weight-based disposal tickets from the dedicated disposal facility, generating a variety of reports to report and analyze the weight-based components of the services provided. EWS maintains a staff of over 10 data entry, administration, customer service representatives and dispatchers all working in unison to gather, evaluate and report all necessary information to remain compliant with the terms and conditions of the RFP. EWS has deployed a pilot project using Air-Weigh on board truck scale technology to several of its service units, with mixed results on the accuracy and consistency. EWS is committed to continuing its project with Air-Weigh to remain at the forefront of weight monitoring technology as it is improved and integrated into the industry.

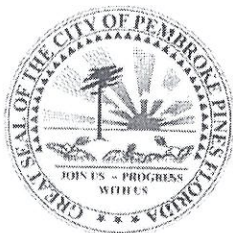

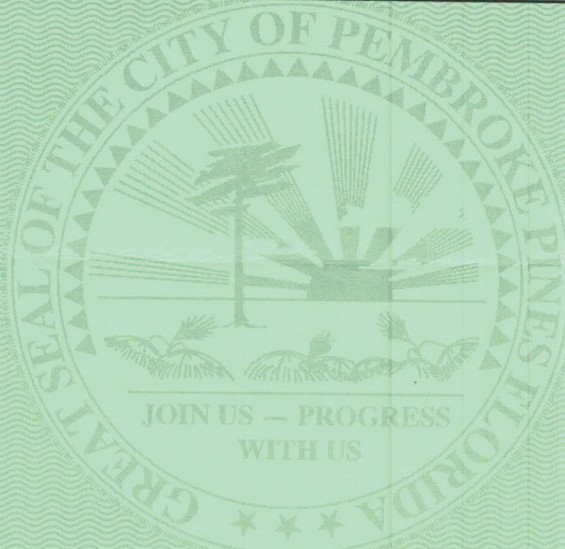

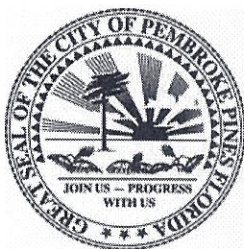

1. "Veteran Owned Small Business" shall mean a business entity which has received a "Determination Letter" from the United States Department of Veteran Affairs Center for Verification and Evaluation notifying the business that they have been approved as a Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB).

A preference of two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total evaluation point, or two and a half percent (2.5%) of the total price, shall be given to the **Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB)**.
